QUEEN CITY ISD PAYS:

- (1) \$700 ABOVE SALARY SCHEDULE AND
- (2) \$1000 FOR A MASTER'S DEGREE AND 18 GRADUATE HOURS IN A SUBJECT WHICH COULD BE TAUGHT AS A HIGH SCHOOL DUAL CREDIT COURSE (18 HOURS MAY BE EARNED WITHIN THE MASTER'S PROGRAM) OR
- (3) \$300 FOR OTHER MASTER'S DEGREES (WHEN NOT REQUIRED BY JOB ASSIGNMENT)

The salary schedule is in accordance with the provisions of TEC 21.402 and applies only to classroom teachers, full-time librarians, full-time counselors, and full-time nurses. There is no state minimum salary for any other position.

Section 21.401 of the Texas Education Code specifies that an educator employed under a 10-month contract must provide a minimum of 187 days of service.

Please note that the actual minimum required to be paid during the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 school years must be determined under Section 21.402(c-1) of the Education Code as added by HB3646. That section requires an increase of the greater of \$80 per month or an amount that represents \$60 /WADA across all eligible employees, above what the individual would have been paid on the district's 2008-2009 salary schedule.

Full-time speech pathologists are not required under HB3646 to be placed on the state mandated minimum salary schedule. For 2009-2010 school year, full-time speech pathologists are required to receive the greater of \$80 per month or an amount that represents \$60 /WADA, above what a full-time speech pathologist would have been paid on the district's 2008-2009 salary schedule. (This mandate expires September 1, 2011)

For the purpose of determining the uniform monthly amount, the product of \$60 multiplied by the number of students in weighted average daily attendance may be reduced by related social security coverage costs and by related payments made by the district under Section 825.405, Government Code.
